WHEREAS by the Crown Lands Consolidation Act it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor might, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, dedicate, in such manner as might seem best for the public interest, any Crown lands for public use for the interment of the dead: Now therefore I, the Governor, in pursuance of the provisions of the above-recited Act, do hereby proclaim that the Crown lands hereinafter described in the schedule hereto shall, from the date hereof, be reserved and dedicated as a site for the interment of the dead, to be called the Public Cemetery of the hundred of Colton.

THE SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Commencing at a point on the eastern side of road east of section 68, hundred of Colton, 12 chains north-north-westerly from the south-west corner of section 87; thence east-north-easterly at right angles for 13 chains; thence north-north-westerly at right angles for 13 chains; thence west-south-westerly at right angles for 13 chains to the eastern side of road aforesaid; thence south-south-easterly along said side of road for 13 chains to the point of commencement.

Given under my hand and the public seal of the said province, at Adelaide, this ninth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and in the forty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

Cemetery Boundaries.—Commencing at the south-west corner of section 151, hundred of Tiparra; thence easterly along the southern boundaries of sections 151 and 152 to the south-east corner of the latter section; thence southerly at an angle of 89° 59' for 1,308 links; thence westerly at an angle of 90° 1' for 1,308 links to the eastern side of road east of section 150; thence northerly along said side of road for 1,308 links to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by the District Councils Act, 1876, it was, amongst other things, enacted that the care, management, and control of all water and other reserves for public convenience, situate within or on the boundaries of any district which, by proclamation of the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might be placed under the care, control, and management of any district council, should be vested in the district council of the district within or on the boundaries of which the same were situate: And whereas for public convenience the land hereafter described has been reserved as a stone reserve, and application has been made to me by the district council of Echunga to have the said reserve under their control and management: Now therefore I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in

2. Dedicate the lands so resumed as a reserve for hospital purposes, and place the said lands, together with the lands which were, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 31st day of May, 1917, dedicated as a reserve for hospital purposes, under the care, control, and management of the district council of Cleve.
