SOUTH AUSTRALIA, { Proclamation by the Deputy for and on behalf of
to wit. His Excellency the Governor of the State of
South Australia.

(L.S.) G. J. R. MURRAY.

BY virtue of the provisions of the Crown Lands Act, 1915, I, the said Deputy Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby dedicate the lands described in the schedule hereto as a reserve for the purposes of a Training College.

THE SCHEDULE.

Comprising that portion of the city of Adelaide, hundred of Adelaide, bounded as follows:—Commencing at a point on the eastern side of Kintore Avenue, distant 620½ links northerly along said side of avenue from the north-west corner of lands placed under control of Public Library, Museum, and Art Gallery Board, as gazetted March 13th, 1902; thence easterly at right angles for 476½ links; thence northerly at right angles for 388½ links; thence westerly at a south-western angle of 88° 38' for 476½ links to the eastern side of Kintore Avenue aforesaid; and thence southerly along said side of avenue for 377 links to the point of commencement; exclusive of all necessary roads and rights-of-ways.

BY virtue of the provisions of the Crown Lands Act, 1915, and the District Councils Act, 1914, I, the said Deputy Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby dedicate the lands described in the schedule hereto as a reserve for district council purposes (being an addition to the existing reserve for the same purpose), and place the said reserve under the care, control, and management of the district council of Yorke Peninsula.

THE SCHEDULE.

Comprising that portion of the town of Maitland, hundred of Maitland, bounded as follows:—Commencing at the south-west corner of allotment 79; thence northerly along its western side to its north-west corner; thence westerly along portion of the southern side of allotment 77 for 158½ links; thence southerly at right angles for 158 links to the northern side of Gardiner Terrace; and thence easterly along said side of terrace for 158½ links to the point of commencement; exclusive of all necessary roads.

BY virtue of the provisions of the Crown Lands Act, 1915, and the District Councils Act, 1914, I, the said Deputy Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby—

1. Resume the Crown lands described in the schedule hereto, being portion of lands which were by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 7th day of January, 1875, dedicated as a reserve for park lands purposes.

2. Dedicate the lands so resumed as a reserve for district council purposes, and place the said reserve under the care, control, and management of the district council of Crystal Brook.

BY virtue of the provisions of the Crown Lands Act, 1915, I the said Deputy Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby resume the lands described in the schedule hereto, being land which were, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th day of March, 1885, dedicated as a reserve for police station and other buildings for public purposes.

THE SCHEDULE.

Town of Cradock.—Comprising the whole of allotments 115 and 116, situate in the town of Cradock, hundred of Wirreanda, and bounded as follows:—Commencing at the intersection of the north-western side of Second Street with the north-eastern side of Fifth Street; thence north-easterly along the north-western side of Second Street for 250 links; thence north-westerly at right angles for 100 links; thence westerly at an angle of 121° for 291½ links to the north-eastern side of Fifth Street; thence south-easterly along said side of street for 250 links to the point of commencement.

Comprising the whole of section 2B, hundred of Giles, exclusive of all necessary roads.

Comprising that portion of the hundred of Barunga being a piece of closed road gazetted August 12th, 1920, extending generally north-easterly from the north-west corner of section 175 for about 70 chains; exclusive of all necessary roads.
