

CROWN LANDS ACT, 1929: HUNDRED OF BLANCHE—
RESERVE RESUMED AND RESERVE DEDICATEDSOUTH AUSTRALIA { Proclamation by His Excellency the Governor
to wit of the State of South Australia

(L.S.) D. B. DUNSTAN

PURSUANT to the Crown Lands Act, 1929, and all other powers,
I, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive
Council:

1. Resume the lands defined in The First Schedule.
2. Dedicate the Crown lands defined in The Second Schedule as a recreation reserve and declare that such lands shall be under the care, control and management of the City of Mount Gambier.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE

Civic Centre Reserve, section 251, Hundred of Blanche, the
proclamation of which was published in the *Government Gazette*
of 15 July 1965, at page 103.

THE SECOND SCHEDULE

Section 251, Hundred of Blanche, County of Grey, exclusive
of all necessary roads, being the whole of the land defined in The
First Schedule hereto except and reserved unto Her Majesty the
Queen full free and unrestricted right and liberty for Herself and
Her agents servants and workmen from time to time and at all
times hereafter to break the surface of dig open up and use that
portion of section 251 bounded as follows:Comprising a strip of land 4.63 metres wide along and
adjoining the south-eastern boundary of section 888; for the
purposes of laying down, fixing, installing, taking up, repairing,
relaying or examining pipes therein on under or above the
said portion of section 251 and of using and maintaining
such pipes and also for such purposes aforesaid full free and
unrestricted right and liberty of entry, egress and regress from
time to time and at all times hereafter with or without horses,
plant, equipment, carts, motor vehicles and other carriages
laden or unladen for Her Majesty the Queen and Her agents,
servants and workmen in through, over, across and along the

FRUIT AND PLANT PROTECTION ACT, 1968—VARIATION
OF PROCLAMATIONSOUTH AUSTRALIA { Proclamation by His Excellency the Governor
to wit of the State of South Australia

(L.S.) D. B. DUNSTAN

PURSUANT to the Fruit and Plant Protection Act, 1968, and all
other powers, I, the Governor, with the advice and consent of
the Executive Council, vary the proclamation made on 5 May
1977 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the same day
at pages 1265 and 1266 by:

1. Deleting the passage: 'oranges, lemons, mandarins' and substituting the passage: 'fruits of the genera Citrus, Fortunella and Poncirus or the hybrids thereof' in subparagraph (a) of paragraph 4.
2. Inserting the following preamble to the *First Schedule*:
'All fruits of the genera Citrus, Fortunella and Poncirus or the hybrids thereof shall be either fumigated or sterilised by cold storage as prescribed by paragraphs (a) or (d) of this Schedule.'
3. Deleting the passage: 'oranges, lemons, mandarins' wherever it appears in the *First Schedule* and in each case substituting the passage: 'fruits of the genera Citrus, Fortunella and Poncirus or the hybrids thereof'.
4. Inserting in paragraph (d) of the *First Schedule* immediately after the word: 'All', the passage: 'fruits of the genera Citrus, Fortunella and Poncirus or the hybrids thereof,' and; immediately after the passage: 'pome fruits', the passage: 'and Chinese gooseberries (or kiwifruit)'.
5. Inserting in paragraph (e) of the *First Schedule* immediately after the word: 'All', the passage: 'fruits of the genera Citrus, Fortunella and Poncirus or the hybrids thereof,' and; immediately after the passage: 'stone fruits', the passage: 'and Chinese gooseberries (or kiwifruit)'.

6. Deleting the passage: 'oranges, lemons, mandarins' in the *Second Schedule* and substituting the passage: 'fruits of the genera Citrus, Fortunella and Poncirus or the hybrids thereof'.

7. Deleting the '*Third Schedule*' and substituting the following:

'THIRD SCHEDULE

Certificate to accompany all fruits of the genera Citrus,
Fortunella and Poncirus or the hybrids thereof, all pome
and stone fruits and Chinese gooseberries (or Kiwifruit)
imported or introduced into South Australia after sterili-
zation against Fruit Fly by Cold Storage.

- (a) the fruit was grown at

- (d) the average flesh temperature during the period of cold storage was °C and did not exceed 0°C by more than 0.5°C at any time during the cold storage treatment period.
- (e) the duration of the cold storage treatment was not less than 14 days.
