PALMERSTON CIRCUIT COURT.

Edithburgh Jetty Traffic.

The harbor-master may at any time, when in his opinion it is desirable to do so, stop all or portion of the traffic of trucks on the Edithburgh jetty, for periods not exceeding thirty minutes at any one time.

Any person or persons neglecting to obey any order given by the harbor-master shall, on being convicted before a magistrate or two justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum of not less than £5 nor more than £50.

Construction of Slips, Jetties, &c., below High-water Mark.

No person shall construct or erect any wharf, jetty, or landing stage, or lay down any slip below high-water mark or other legal boundary of any water frontage without permission or leave from the Marine Board.
