BY virtue of the provisions of The Crown Lands Act, 1915, and The District Councils Act, 1914, I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby dedicate the lands described in the schedule hereto as a reserve for cemetery purposes, and place the said reserve under the care, control, and management of the District Council of Elliston.

THE SCHEDULE.

Comprising that portion of the hundred of Ward bounded as follows:— Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of section 4, distant 2,481 links northerly along said boundary from the south-eastern corner of said section; thence westerly at right angles to said boundary for 250 links; thence north-westerly at a north-eastern angle of 97° 7' for 403 links; thence easterly at a south-eastern angle of 82° 53' for 3 chains to the eastern boundary of section 4 aforesaid; and thence southerly along the western side of road west of section 93 to the point of commencement; exclusive of all necessary roads.
