 to wit. } of the State of South Australia.

BY virtue of the provisions of the District Water Supply Act, 1930, I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the care, control, and management of the water conservation reserve described in the schedule hereto shall be vested in the district council of Carrieton.

BY virtue of the provisions of the Water Conservation Act, 1886, the Crown Lands Act, 1929, and the District Water Supply Act, 1930, I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby:—

1. Dedicate the Crown lands described in the schedule hereto as a reserve for water conservation purposes.
2. Vest the said reserve in the Commissioner of Water Conservation.
