EARLY CLOSING ACT, 1926-1960: TEMPORARY SUSPENSION THEREOF IN CERTAIN SHOPPING DISTRICTS

BY virtue of the provisions of the Early Closing Act, 1926-1960, and all other enabling powers, I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby suspend the operation of the said Act on Thursday, the 24th day of December, 1970, until 9 o'clock in the evening, in so far as the said Act applies to the closing time for every shop other than exempted shops in the Balaklava, Binnun, Caltowie, Grace, Lock, Mintaro, Mount Bryan, Port Broughton, Port Wakefield, Upper Wakefield, Wallaroo and Kadina and Yorke Peninsula shopping districts.

CROWN LANDS ACT, 1929-1969: HUNDRED OF WAURALTEE—PARK LANDS RESUMED AND DEDICATED AND TOWN OF PORT VICTORIA—AREA EXTENDED

SOUTH AUSTRALIA } *Proclamation by His Excellency the*
 to wit } *Governor of the State of South Australia*

BY virtue of the provisions of the Crown Lands Act, 1929-1969, and all other enabling powers, I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby:—

1. Resume the lands defined in the first schedule hereto, being lands which were, by a proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of the 27th day of June, 1968, at page 1864, dedicated for the purposes of park lands.

2. Dedicate the Crown lands defined in the second schedule hereto for the purposes of park lands and declare that such lands shall be under the care, control and management of the district council of Central Yorke Peninsula.

3. Extend the area of the town of Port Victoria by adding thereto the lands defined in the third schedule hereto.

4. Direct that this proclamation shall take effect on the day of publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE

Park lands adjacent to the town of Port Victoria, being sections 270, 281, 283 and 284, hundred of Wauraltee, county of Fergusson.

THE SECOND SCHEDULE

Sections 270, 281, 283 and 284, hundred of Wauraltee, county of Fergusson, exclusive of all necessary roads and being the greater portion of the land defined in the first schedule hereto.

THE THIRD SCHEDULE

That portion of the hundred of Wauraltee, county of Fergusson bounded as follows:—Commencing at the north-western corner of allotment 152, town of Port Victoria, as extended by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of the 12th January, 1961 (paragraph numbered (3) appearing); thence north-north-easterly along portion of the eastern boundary of the town of Port Victoria as extended 12th November, 1959, bearing 11° 12' for a distance of 312.6 links to the southern side of road north of allotment 146 in the latter extension to the said town; east-south-easterly along portion of the said side of road, bearing 101° 12' for 90.0 links; south-south-westerly along a western boundary of section 284 (park lands), bearing 191° 12' for 296.1 links to the northern boundary of the town of Port Victoria as extended by proclamation of the 12th January, 1961, aforesaid; thence easterly along portion of the latter boundary, bearing 270° 50' for 91.5 links to the point of commencement.

CROWN LANDS ACT, 1929-1969: HUNDRED OF WARD—STONE RESERVE RESUMED AND DEDICATED

BY virtue of the provisions of the Crown Lands Act, 1929-1969, and all other enabling powers, I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby:—

1. Resume the lands defined in the first schedule hereto, being the portion of the lands which were, by a proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th day of May, 1916, at page 1095, dedicated for the purposes of a stone reserve.

2. Dedicate the Crown lands defined in the second schedule hereto for the purposes of a stone reserve, and declare that such lands shall be under the care, control and management of the district council of Elliston.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE

Stone reserve, comprising that portion of the hundred of Ward bounded on the north, east and west by portions of section 41 and on the south-west by the north-eastern side of road north-east of portion of section 32.

THE SECOND SCHEDULE

Section 392, hundred of Ward, county of Musgrave, exclusive of all necessary roads and being the greater portion of the land defined in the first schedule hereto.
