WHEREAS by The Teachers' Superannuation Act, 1890, and by The Teachers' Superannuation Further Amendment Act, 1904, power is given to the Board of Management of the Public School Teachers' Superannuation Fund, with the sanction of the Governor, from time to time, to make, alter, and revoke regulations

for carrying out the objects of the said Acts: Now, therefore, the said Board, with the sanction aforesaid, doth hereby revoke regulation 18, and doth hereby make the following regulation in lieu thereof:—

18. The minimum yearly subscription of head teachers and assistant teachers hereafter coming within section 13, subsection II., of The Teachers' Superannuation Act, 1890, shall be in the case of males £8 and in the case of females £6; provided each such subscriber shall from time to time pay an additional annual subscription of £1 for every full £12 10s. by which, up to age 32, being male, the salary shall exceed £100; or, being female, shall exceed £75; and provided also, that if the age at the date of commencing a new subscription or an increase of subscription exceeds the effective average age of subscribers at entry, status, in respect of such new subscription or increase of subscription as the case may require, must be purchased back to such effective average age: Provided further, that the maximum annual payments in respect of subscriptions and purchase of status required from Class IX. teachers (hitherto called provisional teachers) and acting assistants who, after qualifying pursuant to the regulations for the time being of the Education Department, acquire "F" classification (or higher) and whose age exceeds 31 years, shall not exceed the following scale:—
