Approximately 80 people attended the Presentation, first enjoying an excellent bacon and egg breakfast cooked by Lock and Districts Services.

Mayor Hancock presented the Citizen of the Year award to Lisa Kammermann for her services to the District in many volunteer activities. Lisa was described as the "quiet achiever" whose selfless commitment to her community, leadership and coordinating skills are exemplary. Lisa has been a member of the SA Ambulance Service for over 18 years and in 2017 received a 15 year service award. She has given her time to the Lock Netball Club, taking on many executive roles and also participating at league level in junior netball and SAPSASA sports. She is a long term member of and currently treasurer of the Lock Ladies Auxiliary Committee, treasurer of the Lock Uniting Church, member for 12 years and currently treasurer of the Lock Area School Parents and Friends Committee and secretary of the Lock Area School Governing Council to name just a few of her many achievements. Influx of tourists over Festive Season

As you would have noticed, our coastal areas, like the rest of Eyre Peninsula encountered a larger than usual influx of visitors during the festive holidays. It was great news for the local businesses who benefited from the extra people, either staying with them, purchasing supplies or eating out.

Whilst the recent upgrades to the campsite facilities, such as the toilets, and the presence of outdoor staff helped in limiting the damage to these areas, the pressure on Council's resources was great and there have been issues that our District experienced. Council has identified some areas to consider prior to the next potential influx, possibly Easter and April school holidays.

Council will liaise with National Parks in relation to Lake Newland Conservation Park and monitoring activities that occur within its boundaries, and also with SAPOL in relation to extra staff for enforcing road rules. Council will also advocate for extra funds for improvements to camp sites and specific officers for the managing of people and their activities in areas that do not come under Council's care and control.

We encourage everyone in the community to take extra care on the roads, slowing down, especially where children may be present.

Community Grants Program

Council's adopted Community Grants Policy provides community groups with the opportunity to apply for financial assistance throughout the financial year. It is anticipated that this process will assist Council in supporting a range of projects and activities based on their ability to enhance the quality of life, deliver services and provide facilities to the community. ALL dogs and cats are required to be registered at 12 weeks of age. You can do this yourself online by going to www.dogsandcatsonline.com.au.

If you require assistance please call the Council Customer Service Centre 8687 9177.

ALL dogs and cats are required to be microchipped.
Your pet's microchipping details should be entered in your Dogs and Cats Online account.

ALL dogs and cats are to be desexed by 6 months of age. Exemptions are for working dogs. Large breed dogs may be delayed for desexing. An exemption must be authorised by a veterinarian to support this. If you intend to breed from your pet you must register as a breeder at www.dogsandcatsonline.com.au. New laws regulate the breeding and selling of dogs and cats in South Australia. To find out more information go to www.dogandcatboard.com.au/Breeding-Selling-and-Buying.

Socialise your dog with other humans and animals. Teach children how to behave appropriately around your pet. Dogs and cats are great companions and lifelong friends. Pet ownership is extremely rewarding and has also been associated with healthy living and overall life enjoyment.

Recycling Tips

Recycling of bubble wrap and other air filled, cushioning, clear soft plastics

These items are commonly placed in with your goods to protect them when your goods are sent via post. Both items can be REDcycled (placed in the REDcycle bins in Woolworths [near checkouts] and Coles [in foyer] in Pt Lincoln) – but a couple of things to remember:

- please cut bubble wrap down to approximately A3 size if it is very large
- please let the air out of the larger air filled cushioning pockets so it takes up less space when scrunched

Circular Economy

Did you know that the Elliston Council is doing what it can to be part of the circular economy when it comes to plastic waste. While Australia still has lots of plastic currently in use it is beneficial for us to reuse and recycle as much as we can to prevent it from ending up polluting our environment. Soft plastics that have been recycled through the REDcycle program and turned into another useable product, have been used in the staircase at the Elliston Jetty and the Elliston Look-out. As well as being a recycled material this product is able to withstand our harsh environment for many years and requires little maintenance, which is an extra benefit.
